Here is a list of a few Hotels I promised you & that I can recommend (there are hundreds of others, of course!) Most are on the Left Bank but a couple on the Right Bank. Never stayed in any of them but friends have, etc. The prices quoted are for a double or twin room with bath/shower & WC. Breakfast is extra. Prices may vary a little according to season, situation in the hotel etc. but I'll put the lower & the higher figure (where there is one). They could also increase a little. Rooms in all the hotels in these price ranges tend to be rather small by NZ standards. But all neat & tidy & clean!!
